Topic Overview

Key Vocabulary

Greenhouse gases

Definition: Gases like carbon dioxide and methane that trap heat in the Earth's atmosphere.

Example Sentence: "Burning fossil fuels releases greenhouse gases that contribute to climate change."

Carbon footprint

Definition: The total amount of carbon dioxide produced by one's activities. Example Sentence: "Taking public transport can help reduce your carbon footprint."

Idioms & Phrases

✓ "a ticking time bomb" – A situation or person that may cause serious problems in the future, even if things seem okay now.

Example: "The lack of clean water in the area is a ticking time bomb for public health." (그 지역의 깨끗한 물 부족 문제는 공중보건에 있어 언제 터질지 모르는 시한폭탄이다.)

✓ "turn a blind eye" – To ignore something wrong or bad on purpose; to pretend not to see a problem.

Example: "The teacher turned a blind eye to the students using their phones in class." (선생님은 수업 중 휴대폰을 사용하는 학생들을 모른 척 하셨다.)
